SCENE DEVELOPMENT
A NIGHT'S PASSAGE

Along with the newsletter specials, Q/A's, and creature and character profiles, I want to start a new newsletter section on scene development. The most frequent question I get is: "how did you come up with this stuff?" so I want to use this newsletter to let you into my writing process. I've done this in previous answers before, but I'll give an inside look on some of my favorite scenes from the first novel. (No spoilers of course)

Scene(s): *Samuel's walks through the forest*

Samuel is constantly traveling throughout both novels, and sometimes reflects upon how beautiful the island can be; despite its many perils. The majority of the novel follows a classic writing pattern of rising and falling action, constantly building up towards more key story moments, then back down to something where the reader can 'catch their breath'. Writing intense fight scenes can be very difficult, because I can only focus on one character's action at a time. The longer the fight scene is, the easier it is for the reader to get lost in the middle of all the action. I use the forest 'walks' or brief reflections to give the reader an insight into Samuel's perspective and thoughts about his surroundings and events.

"Ruby it is then. Come on, Ruby, pick it up!" I said to the horse as I lightly dug my heels into her side.
